Recognizing the Lord

In Mary Oliver's newest book of poetry simply entitled *Thirst*, she includes a lovely poem called "Six Recognitions of the Lord." In the poem's fourth and fifth sections she writes,

Of course I have always known you are present in the clouds, and the black oak I especially adore, and the wings of the birds. But you are present too in the body, listening to the body, teaching it to live, instead of all that touching, with disembodied joy. We do not do this easily. We have lived so long in the heaven of touch, and we maintain our mutability, our physicality, even as we begin to apprehend the other world. Slowly we make our appreciative response. Slowly appreciation swells to astonishment. And we enter the dialogue of our lives that is beyond all understanding or conclusion. It is mystery. It is love of God. It is obedience. Oh, feed me this day, Holy Spirit, with the fragrance of the fields and the freshness of the oceans which you have made, and help me to hear and to hold in all dearness those exacting and wonderful words of our Lord Jesus Christ, saying: Follow me.

My hope for the coming year is that in wondrous fashion we may find ourselves once more astonished as we seek to enter into the life-giving "dialogue of our lives that is beyond all understanding or conclusion,"



WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY GROUP


